NEWS FROM THE CLERK'S DESK:

The Town annual meeting can be held within 10 days of the third Tuesday in April only if that date is set at the previous annual meeting).

NEWS FROM THE CHAIRMAN'S DESK:

• Once again I will remind those of you who plant crops to respect the road right of way and not plant it.

- While on that subject, as you need to access your fields with larger and larger equipment please take a look and see it you need a wider field entrance. We need to minimize damage to the road surface from turning the large vehicles.
- We have been experiencing failures in some of our cross culverts. If you are aware of a culvert with a road surface failure on top of it please inform a town board member.
- We are discussing the road system to determine which road to work on this year. We are planning on the North mile of Plier Road at this time. We have to remain flexible in case of a road failure thru the winter.

• Dog Owners: Now is the time to license your pet for 2013. Fees are as follows: \$3 spayed or neutered, \$8 not spayed or neutered. If your pets rabies certificate has expired you need to submit an updated one in order for a license to be issued.

The town is required to provide a dog count to Shawano County. <u>Dog owners without the proper license are subject to a fine from the Shawano County Sheriff's Department.</u>

GARBAGE & RECYCLING:

*** Per Harter's Fox Valley Disposal- If a holiday falls in the week of our normal pickup before our normal pickup day (Wednesday), pickup will be pushed back one day (to Thursday).*** (If you have questions on this, please call either Harter's Fox Valley Disposal or the Clerk.) Garbage labels are \$1.00 each and can be purchased at the Lakeview Quick Mart (bp) in Cecil (on the hill on Hwy 117), Riverview Quick Mart (bp) in Oconto Falls, Cecil Lakeside Mobil, Take A Chance Bar (Advance), Rosie's Bar (Green Valley), the Bullpen Bar (Pulcifer) any of the Board members, mail a check & SASE to the Clerk, at the Community Center on election days, at the Community Center before or after monthly Board meetings, when paying property taxes. You must place a green sticker

from the Town of Green Valley on each clear 30-gallon garbage bag. Recyclables can be mixed in blue bags.

Large items in our Town are picked up the 3rd Thursday of each month. You must call Harter's Fox Valley Disposal at least one day prior to the 3rd Thursday pick-up to get on the pick-up list for that month. Some items require a fee to be picked up; call Harter's for information.

Harter's Fox Valley Disposal picks up garbage and recycling every other Wednesday.

Northeast Wis. – Water samples from several private wells with high arsenic levels are spurring state drinking water officials to encourage homeowners in parts of Oconto County and Shawano County to test their drinking water wells for arsenic, a carcinogen.

The areas most likely to be affected in Shawano County include the towns of Angelica, Maple Grove, Green Valley, Hartland and Lessor. In Oconto County, residents in the towns of Oconto Falls, Morgan, Chase, Stiles and Abrams are encouraged to test their wells, according to JaNelle Merry, a private water supply specialist with the Department of Natural Resources.

Arsenic is a natural element found in soil and bedrock throughout Wisconsin. Under certain conditions, arsenic can be released into groundwater and enter water wells. Long-term exposure to arsenic in drinking water is known to increase risks of skin, bladder, lung, liver, colon, and kidney cancer. Other health effects may include blood vessel damage, high blood pressure, nerve damage, anemia, stomach upsets, diabetes, and skin changes, according to the Wisconsin Department of Health Services.

Signs your well water may have high arsenic levels

An increase in iron staining on fixtures or a change in color of the water may be an indicator of possible problems. For more information about arsenic contamination and drinking water wells, as well as information about ordering water test kits from a lab of your choice, visit the DNR website at http://dnr.wi.gov/topic/Groundwater/arsenic/.

Residents in the affected communities can also contact their local health department if they have concerns about arsenic in their drinking water. In Oconto County, residents should call the Oconto County Public Health Department at (920) 834-7000. In Shawano County, residents should contact the Shawano-Menominee Counties Health Department at (715) 526-4808 with questions, or to obtain a water test kit.

GREEN VALLEY-MORGAN FIRE DEPARTMENT:

Another year gone....

...and maybe that's OK. After this past summer, I'm pretty sure there are some people that hope they never have another summer like that again. The lack of moisture affected all of us somehow. There are some people that watched their crops wither away in the endless sunshine, and those people will be trying to recover for months to come. The road construction crews on Highway 22 were able to finish the project on time, which made everyone a little happier. There are some people that were fortunate enough to get the rain exactly when they needed it and it may have made the summer and harvest of 2012 the best ever! I think most of us enjoyed the extra time off as a result of not having to mow the lawn as often! Even with the lack of moisture here in Wisconsin, we are certainly more fortunate than those that had to deal with tornadoes, hurricanes, forest fires, extreme drought, and the 'manmade horror stories' with all of the recent shootings.

The Green Valley – Morgan Fire Company did have a few extra grass fires and machinery fires this past year. It's hard to determine if it was due to the dry weather, the hot weather, or just plain bad luck, but the well that we have at the Green Valley station was used quite often this past year. Hauling water, topping of the tenders, and washing hose were the more popular activities happening in front of the station! We are also able to fill our trucks at Green Valley Dairy and at Wagner Farms if we ever need to and at any time, and for that we are extremely thankful to them! It has also proved to be very beneficial to have another static water source in case we have several trucks that need to be filled at the same time. Or if something just isn't working right at one of the wells, there is a 'backup'. We also saw more vehicle accidents in Green Valley and Morgan this year. Unfortunately, some lives were lost and many more were affected. We hope this was a trend that we can attribute to the road construction on Highway 22. Let us all remember to use extra caution in and around the areas of road construction and detours in the future.

The Green Valley – Morgan Fire Company is still looking forward to both Oconto and Shawano Counties going live with the MABAS (Mutual Aid Box Alarm System) program very soon. As of January 10, 2013, Oconto County has gone live with MABAS. Shawano County is still actively working on getting the necessary paperwork completed with all of the townships and planning on how the response system should work for each emergency agency. It is anticipated that this will take about 6 months to complete. There are countless meeting hours of preparing, planning and training that need to be completed before everyone is set to go live so that a large event, such as the fire in Pulaski, can run as smooth and as efficient as possible.

Please remember to keep the winter fire safety tips in mind: Have your furnace checked to make sure it's working properly; keep outdoor vents clear of snow and ice to prevent carbon monoxide poisoning in the home; keep indoor furnishings at least 3 feet away from all heating equipment; check and periodically clean chimneys if burning wood; never leave lit candles unattended; and of course, check your smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors. Daylight Saving Time begins on March 10 – "Change Your Clocks, Change Your Batteries!"

The annual meeting for the Green Valley – Morgan Fire Company, Inc. was held on January 8, 2013. The following items were reviewed and discussed: The secretary's minutes, the treasurer's report, the fire runs in 2012, the fire inspections that were made in the two townships, and the budget for 2013. Elections for officer positions were also held with the following results: Chief – Leonard Wahl, Assistant Chief – Joel Nischke, Captain – Randy Konkle, Lieutenant – Matt Bohm, Treasurer – Carmen Wetzel, Secretary – Jeff Engebretsen, Safety Officer – Carmen Wetzel, and Deputy Fire Inspectors – Randy Konkle and John Davis. The Board of Directors representing the town of Green Valley consists of John Davis, Derick Dittman, Dan Pate, Dennis Pederson, and Matt Porter. The Board of Directors representing the Town of Morgan consists of Matt Bohm, Arnold Gaertig, Cory VandenElzen, Shawn VandenElzen, and Dana Wahl.
